## New Music Leaders at First UMC of Blirstown



The First United Methodist Church of Blirstown is pleased to announce two new staff members for their worship music team. In March, Keyboardist and Vocalist Andie Baldwin and Drummer Joe Celentano will begin sharing the helm as they lead the church's worship team and parishioners in a wide variety of contemporary and fresh traditional music.

Baldwin is 17 years old, and lives locally to the UMC in Blirstown. Music has been a part of her life since day one. In addition to her work at the church, she is a full-time student, plays gigs at restaurants, concerts, and local events, and is currently recording her first studio album. Baldwin has been a member of the church for several years now and has been a part of the worship team, playing keyboards and singing backup vocals. She looks forward to bringing her talent to the music program and allowing people to not only hear the music but also feel

the Grace of God through it.

Celentano has lived in Central New Jersey for most of his life, playing in several Rock and Roll bands, while learning much about music discipline concerning music balance. When he first relocated to Blirstown in 2002 with his wife Barbara, son Joey and daughter Nina, he set music aside for a while. After joining the First United Methodist Church in 2004, he fell in love with Contemporary Christian Music. Shortly thereafter, Celentano founded the first Praise Band at FUMC in 2006 with a few musicians and began to bring contemporary music into the church's traditional worship service. Since that time he has continued to build up the worship team and share his love for contemporary Christian music with the congregation.

# Annual Conference Recap



## Episcopal Address

In his opening address, Bishop John Schol celebrated the ministries of congregations in Greater New Jersey, sharing ways that clergy and congregational leaders have demonstrated their love through mission and outreach. He shared the good works of GNJ's vital mission partners who witness to our communities through mission, financial management, engaging young disciples and serving housing needs. In a personal and emotional witness to the state of the church, he shared his commitment to explore new expressions of Methodism in the wake of current disagreements over homosexuality. "Let me be clear, I am not interested in changing a few paragraphs in The Book of Discipline and then call it a day. The Gospel demands more of us, of me and of you as leaders of the church of Jesus Christ. God is ready to do new things through us and while it will not look the same, it will be Wesleyan, it will be connectional, it will be transformative and it will turn the church outward.

Bishop Schol called for 50 congregations to volunteer to pilot the next Methodism. He called for others to continue to move our mission forward: 75 congregations who are interested in becoming the next Hope Center, 30 congregations who want to partner to start and grow a youth ministry program. 100 congregations who are ready and willing to be the next miracle in the Miracles Everywhere Campaign, 10 congregations ready to invest with the Stewardship Foundation to move us forward into what is next and 10 congregations who are ready to start a new worship experience.

## Leadership

GNJ leaders shared the fruits of our ministry and the steps we have taken to fulfill our 2023 Strategic Plan including resources like Leadership 100, the Pathway to Discipleship, the Breakthrough Worship Series, the Clergy Leadership Development Initiative, Clergy Coaching, PaCE groups, Team Vital, the Congregational Leadership Development Initiative and more.

Outside of regular sessions, United Methodists served communion on the beach and boardwalk, meditated in communal prayer at our prayer stations, shared fellowship at one of the group or general meals and packed 30,000 meals for Rise Against Hunger. GNJ received a generous offering of \$31,281.50 from our congregations for the Miracles Everywhere Campaign which is supporting our partnership with Tanzania and Puerto Rico, Next Generation Ministries and A Future With Hope.



## The Way Forward

Holy Conferencing took on new meaning Tuesday as the conference discussed the work of The Way Forward Team. Bishop John Schol invited all members of the Way Forward Team to join him in sharing their work, by focusing on the tools of having an outward mindset. David Wherle, the vice chair of the Wesleyan Covenant Association and Amanda Hemenetz, the chair of Reconciling Ministries, both gave witness to how the team is lifting them up and giving them hope for a way forward. Members of the body stepped to the microphones to share where they saw themselves in the boxes that kept us inward and where in our lives we experienced outward ministries. Our conferencing concluded at the table that Jesus set for us. We held communion as Bishop Schol proclaimed the mystery of our faith and the fragility of all of us in this liminal time.

The United Methodist Women celebrated 150 years of the organization on May 19. During our worship service we dedicated a butterfly bush in honor of former members of the group. The women also held a bake sale in conjunction with the Mother's Day plant sale on May 10 & 11. We raised over \$600 and \$500 will be donated to the Red Bird Mission trip. We want to thank Stefanie Fredericks from Sweet Luxe Cakes for donating baked goods and her time for the sale. In April, the women collected items for St. Hubert's animal shelter in Roxbury. We collected 18 bags of items along with 42 lbs of dog and 22 lbs of cat food, 32 cans of dog/cat food, a large pack of paper towels and donated \$50 in memory of Karen San-Filippo.



The Northwest NJ Parkinson's Support Group will present



## 4-H Garden Group

The Plants vs. Zombies 4-H Garden Club is at it again this year! We are happy to get back into our food pantry garden located outside of the church courtyard and are expanding within the garden fencing. We have enlisted the help of local Rutgers Master Gardener, Jodi Butler, to help us.

We are excited to be getting some hands-on learning together with 'Straw Bale Gardening.' This is where vegetables are grown directly inside of straw bale and there are many benefits to this technique. The straw bales can be placed really anywhere with full sun and access to water—even in places with poor soil, or no soil at all! The plants get nutrients from the composting process taking place inside of the bale. By the end of the season, the bales are broken down and ready to throw into your backyard compost. Straw bales are perfect height for comfortable reach, reduce the amount of weeds and reduce soil-borne diseases and pests.



This year, the club plans to grow tomatoes, cucumbers, strawberries, kale, herbs, green beans, beets and more. Some seeds have already been sown, and the best part is that all of the produce will be donated to our local food pantries.
